

Level Two - Dance Uniform for Females

Requirements:

1. Pink footed or convertible tights or solid pink dance socks in ballet class only.
2. Solid pink or black leotard of any modest style.
3. Ballet: Pink leather ballet slippers, Tap/Jazz: black Maryjane taps and tan jazz slippers.
4. Hair secured in a bun or other teacher approved style.

Optional:

1. Single or double layer skirt in solid pink or solid black.
2. Dance sweater in solid pink or solid black. Must not go lower than the navel.
3. Leg warmers in solid black or solid pink.
4. A bun cover or other hair accessories, must be solid black or solid pink.
5. A solid black or solid pink unitard may be worn with a solid black or solid pink skirt in place of tights and leotard. Shoes, bun and socks or tights are still required.

Not Allowed:

1. Street clothing such as t-shirts, sweatshirts, joggers, shorts, and sweaters.
2. Hair to be unsecured in a way that it is able to reach the dancers eyes or could fall.
3. Hair accessories worn in any other color than solid black or pink, or that may fall off.
4. Any jewelry except for post-style stud earrings: metal, thread, plastic, beads, etc. This includes watches, necklaces, bracelets, hoop or dangle earrings, anklets and toe rings.
5. No tutus allowed in class.

Damaged and Needing Replaced:

Shoes, tights and sometimes even leotards wear out to the extreme that they need replaced. Uniform items that contain holes and sometimes stains need to be replaced. Dancers should be neat in appearance.

When A Dancer Is Not In Uniform:

Life happens - for everyone. We completely understand! It is most important that a dancer arrives and is able to take class even in the event that he/she is not properly dressed. If this occurs, please come on to class and privately speak with the teacher about the missing or damaged part of your uniform for the day. We can try to find a replacement to borrow if something was forgotten or purchase a replacement if it is completely lost or damaged. Please do not take the pardon as your teacher passively not enforcing the uniform requirements. If a dancer is consistently not wearing the appropriate attire they will need to speak with the teacher and parents to try to form a better plan for preparing for dance classes each week. Any jewelry other than post-style studded earrings will be removed and placed in a Ziplock bag and stored in the dancer's dance bag.
